Liver Disease

The patient has both 1 and 2:

- **1.** Synthetic liver failure as demonstrated by \mathbf{a} or \mathbf{b} and \mathbf{c} :
 - **a.** Prothrombin time (PTT) prolonged more than five seconds over control *OR*
 - **b.** International Normalized Ratio (INR) >1.5
 - C. Serum albumin <2.5 gm/dl

AND

- 2. End-stage liver disease is present and the patient has one or more of the following conditions:
 - Ascites, refractory to treatment, or patient declines or is non-compliant
 - History of spontaneous bacterial peritonitis
 - Hepatorenal syndrome (elevated creatinine with oliguria [<400 ml/day])
 - Hepatic encephalopathy, refractory to treatment or patient non-compliant
 - History of recurrent variceal bleeding despite intensive therapy or patient declines therapy

Supporting evidence for hospice eligibility:

- Progressive malnutrition
- Muscle wasting with reduced strength
- Ongoing alcoholism (>80 gm ethanol/day)
- Hepatocellular carcinoma
- Hepatitis B surface antigen positive
- Hepatitis C refractory to interferon treatment

In the absence of one or more of these findings, rapid decline or comorbidities may also support eligibility for hospice care.
